

School Goals 2021-2022

Reading: 35% of students will achieve proficiency at the end of level testing in literacy as measured by Acadience end of year. 25% will achieve proficiency in mid-year Acadience testing.

Math: 35% will achieve proficiency as measured by end of level Acadience testing. 25% at mid-year Benchmark.

Achievement Gap Goal: 35% of MLL (Multilingual Learners) students will reach a 5 or higher on the WIDA taken at the end of the school year. Progress monitoring
